CELEBRATING THE WORK OF WILLIAM SHAKESPEARE

William Shakespeare was born on April 23, 1564 to John Shakespeare and Mary Arden in the town of Stratford-upon-Avon He received his education at Stratford Grammar School but was pulled out early as his family couldn't afford it In 1582, he married Anne Hathaway and had three children, Susanna (1583) and twins Hamnet and Judith (1585)
